## 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

### Description of necessary measures

**Inhalation:** First aid measures not required.  
**Skin contact:** First aid measures not required. Cosmetic product and therefore not necessary.  
**Eye contact:** Rinse eyes immediately with plenty of water, occasionally lifting upper and lower lids, until no evidence of product remains. Get medical attention if pain or irritation develops.

### Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed

After eye contact: May cause mild transient irritation After skin contact: Repeated or prolonged excessive exposure may cause irritation or sensitization dermatitis in previously exposed individuals. After ingestion: Ingestion may cause irritation of mouth, throat, digestive tract, diarrhea and vomiting.

### Indication of any immediate medical attention and special treatment needed

## 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES
